As a small press publisher and editor, Creeley possessed an unfailing flair for recognizing talent, and promoted the likes of Layton, Ginsberg, Kerouac, Olson, and Burroughs . Their stars rose while he scraped by, until his poetry collection For Love and a novel, The Island, earned him fame and a critical acclaim largely denied the Beat writers.
